I must apologise for not sending out a March Newsletter, I had a senior moment at the time and included two photos of my cloche, but no Newsletter.

I have started sowing seeds for the coming summer in a propagator in a spare room. I do not have any electrical heating in my greenhouse, only a paraffin heater for cold nights. This will keep frost out of the greenhouse but does not have sufficient heat to propagate the seeds.

I have planted onion sets and shallots in the garden, and have been busy potting up the dahlias that have been over wintering in boxes. The lighter evenings sure indicates winter is over and we are well into spring.

Roger suggested that for the August 6th meeting we might have a trip to Wells Cathedral, and have a guided tour of The Bishop's Palace Garden. We would have to make our own way to Wells, arriving at

2.30pm for a 3pm tour. The cost of the visit would be £9.50p per person. I am sure we can coordinate to have some car sharing. We would like your thoughts at the April meeting for numbers.

We would like to hold a Garden Competition this year, during the 1st week of July. The categories proposed will be: Small /Medium Garden; A Border; A Hanging Basket; A Pot / Tub.

If you have any friends or family who would like to come along, everyone will be made welcome.

Memberships can be renewed before the meeting and during refreshments.

As per the AGM voting, Single Membership is £12, Family Membership is £17.

Entrance for the meeting is £2 per member and £3 per non-member.
